DOUBLE GOLD FOR THE MIDGET COYOTES

Coyotes squad of 98s and 99s open season with back-to-back tournament victories

in a one month span.

Heading in to the 2015-2016 season looking to build on last season's bronze medal finish at the OMHA Championship, the Midget Coyotes have certainly served notice that they will be a team to reckon with after capturing the Championship trophy at their first two tournaments of the season.

The Midget schedule kicks off each year with the Toronto Titans Midget Prospect Tournament in late September, a tournament that attracted 36 teams from around the province. The Coyotes found themselves slotted in to Division 6 for round robin play and racked up a 3-0-1 record by defeating the Mississauga Rebels 4-0, the Cambridge Hawks 5-0, the Sudbury Nickel City Wolves 6-0, and tying the host Titans 1-1. Heading to the Round of 16 to begin the playoff rounds, the Coyotes continued their winning ways defeating the North York Rangers by a 2-1 score and advancing to the quarter-finals on Sunday morning. Richmond Hill got the day started off on the right foot with an exciting 1-0 win over the Waterloo Wolves and then defeated ETA rival North Central predators by a 4-2 score in the semi-finals. Facing a strong Mississauga Reps team in the Championship final, the Coyotes produced another defensive gem, handing the Reps their first loss of the season and clinching the Championship behind a 3-1 victory.

Less than a month later, the Coyotes travelled east to attend the Ottawa Senators Midget Showcase in the nation's capital, facing a 35 team field in their second tournament of the season. Starting off by again facing the Rebels, the Coyotes won their opening game 4-2 and followed that up by defeating the Gloucester Rangers 4-1 later that day. Saturday saw the Covotes handed their first loss of the tournament schedule, losing 2-0 to the Smith Falls Bears before rebounding with a 4-0 shutout of the Kapuskasing Flyers. Heading in to the playoff round once again, the Coyotes took down the Don Mills Flyers 2-1 in the guarter-finals and the North York Rangers 5-2 in the semi-finals to advance to the Championship against the Brockville Braves. The stifling defence proved to be too much for the Braves as the Coyotes skated off with a 5-1 victory and another Championship trophy.

The Coyotes will be looking to continue their run of tournament success when they travel to Sudbury for the Big Nickel Tournament in the first week of November.





Minor Coyotes Update

NOVICE

The Novice Coyotes enter November holding on to 2nd place in the reformed 9 team Novice loop with a record of 7-3-2 after their opening 12 games. Collecting wins against Peterborough (3-1, 6-5, 2-0), Oshawa (5-4), Whitby (5-0, 1-0), and Ajax-Pickering (4-3), the Coyotes also earned points with ties against Oshawa (2-2) and Whitby (4-4) to stay in the four-way battle for top of the standings.

On the tournament front, the Novice Coyotes performed well in two tournaments during the pre-season finishing with an overall record of 7-2 playing at a Canlan Ice Sports showdown in Toronto and the Pat Larock Tournament in Peterborough.

MINOR ATOM

The Minor Atom Coyotes started the year by entering the Toronto Marlboros Friendship Tournament in early September, gathering a 2-2 record with victories over the Toronto Nationals (6-3) and Hamilton Jr Bulldogs (2-0). Having played 12 regular season games, the Minor Atoms have a 4-5-3 record including wins over Central Ontario 6-3, 9-2), Clarington (8-7), and Whitby (6-1). Their best showing of the early season may have been in their 1-1 tie against the then unbeaten Barrie Jr Colts.

ΑΤΟΜ

Much like the Novices, our Atom Coyotes head in to November sporting a 7-3-2 record after 12 regular season games. Their two ties have come against Barrie (0-0) and Ajax-Pickering (3-3) while they have collected wins against Kingston (5-4), North Central (7-3), Ajax-Pickering (4-1), Clarington (4-3), Peterborough (2-1), Oshawa (4-0) and Central Ontario (3-2).

Outside of ETA play, the Atoms have already played in two tournaments, defeating the Mississauga Rebels in the Toronto Marlboros Friendship Tournament in September and West Seneca in the Toronto Junior Canadiens Cup in October.

Junior Coyotes Update

MINOR PEEWEE

The Minor Peewee Coyotes got their season started with an appearance at the Toronto Marlboros Friendship Tournament earning victories over Victory Honda and the Toronto Nationals to finish with a 2-2 record. Entering the Toronto Junior Canadiens Cup in October and advancing to the playoff round, they were defeated by the host Junior Canadiens team who went on to win the tournament.

In ETA play, the Minor Peewees enter November in a heated battle for top spot in the Division sporting a 6-2-2 record after recording wins against North Central (6-2), Markham (2-0, 4-1), Peterborough (5-1), Ajax-Pickering (4-1) and Oshawa (3-1) in their opening 10 games.

PEEWEE

The Peewee Coyotes are off to a strong start this season and enter November sitting in first place with a 8-1-3 record thanks to victories over Kingston (4-1), Markham (3-0, 4-0), Ajax-Pickering (5-1), Central Ontario (9-0), Whitby (4-1), Quinte (3-0), North Central (4-2) and Barrie (2-1, 4-2). The team has competed in one tournament so far this season, the Toronto Junior Canadiens Cup. There, the Peewee Coyotes defeated the highly ranked Toronto Young Nationals in the quarter-finals before being halted in the semi-finals by Colorado.

MINOR BANTAM

The Minor Bantam Coyotes travelled to Ottawa in September to start their season by attending the Ottawa Senators Sensplex AAA Shootout where they defeated Upper Canada and Huron-Perth on their way to a 2-1-1 record. They recorded the same record in their second tournament, at the Peterborough Icefest Tournament in October, where they recorded wins over Wheatfield and Halton.

In regular season play, the Minor Bantams currently sit with a 4-5-1 record after 10 games. Along the way, the Minor Bantams have earned victories over Ajax-Pickering (2-0, 3-1), Oshawa (6-2), and Whitby (5-3). Their lone tie came against Central Ontario (3-3) to give them a 4-2-1 record in their last 7 games.

Senior Coyotes Update

BANTAM

After winning their first regular season game against Central Ontario (2-1), the Bantam Coyotes have since put together a 5-4-3 record after their opening 12 ETA regular season games. The Bantams have defeated York Simcoe twice (4-1, 3-2) including in a game which was broadcast by Rogers TV York Region channel. The Bantams were able to pull off a tie against Barrie (3-3),

the only undefeated team in their league, while also earning wins over North Central (2-1, 3-0) and ties against Markham (1-1) and Oshawa (1-1).

Entering two tournaments thus far, the Bantams advanced all the way to the finals of the Markham Majors Fall Classic, defeating the host Majors in triple OT in the semi-finals, before losing to the Toronto Junior Canadiens in a 3-1 game sealed with a last minute empty net goal by Toronto.

MINOR MIDGET

It has been a busy start to the season for the Minor Midget Coyotes after taking part in the Toronto Titans Showcase (September), and Hamilton Huskies Tim Hortons Invitational (October) tournaments in the early going. The Minor Midgets came back from those events having picked up wins over Oakville and Amherst and earning a tie against North York. In ETA regular season action, the Minor Midgets head in to the month of November with a 4-8 record after 12 games played. The Minor Midgets have earned two victories against Ajax-Pickering (6-4, 7-6) and then had a two game winning streak beating Quinte (7-2) and Oshawa (3-0) on back to back days in late October.

MIDGET

The Midget Coyotes are 9-1-0 so far in league play upping their overall record to 25-2-2 overall.
